



## General Education Certificate of Completion through IVC (3/22/18)

The courses listed below are available from Snow College Concurrent Enrollment through IVC (Interactive Video Conferencing). Each high school decides which IVC classes it wants to make available to its students. There may be other courses available at your high school taught Face-to-Face (not IVC) which may also satisfy one or more of these requirements. A minimum of one-third of the total credits needed to complete the Certificate of Completion must be received from Snow College in order for the Certificate to be issued from Snow College. Credits earned at other institutions may be transferred to Snow College to help complete the Certificate's requirements.

Snow College's General Education (GE) program provides the subject-area knowledge and learning skills foundation. **Core** courses make up the general education foundation. **Knowledge Area** courses give an opportunity to take classes specific to your intended major. GE learning outcomes are designed to help students acquire skills and knowledge that continue to enhance during their studies at Snow College. You must choose between a GE Certificate of Science (more science, no foreign language) or a GE Certificate of Arts (one year of French and less science).

General education courses are highly advisable for concurrent enrollment students. They are: 1. Required for college graduation. 2. Transferable from one Utah System of Higher Education (USHE) institution to another. Students completing all GE credits – *approximately 6 concurrent enrollment classes each junior and senior year of high school* – can earn a *Snow College Certificate of Completion in General Education* that is transferrable to all USHE institutions. If you know the four-year college you plan to attend, discuss which classes to take with your Snow College Academic Advisor.

1. **Review the class list. Follow the instructions, in blue, to select classes in each GE category.** NOTE: There are multiple choices in most categories and for a lot of reasons (from personal interest to "fits with what you want to study in college") one or another might be the best choice for you.
2. **Meet with your high school counselor and Snow College.** a. Speak with your high school counselor about your SEOP and course availability at your high school.  
b. Discuss this worksheet with your Snow College Concurrent Enrollment Academic Advisor who can discuss how your course choices will fit different degree programs.
